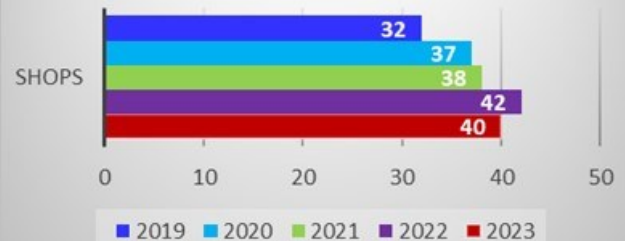

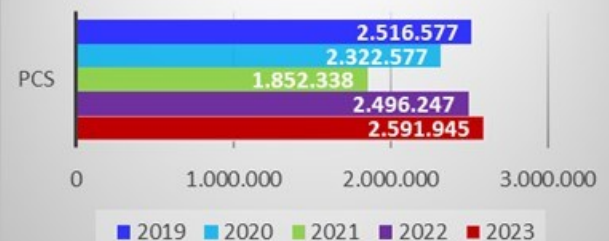


Our main supplier is HUMANA Kleidersammlung GmbH who collects and sorts used clothes in Germany. At the end of 2023, our 409 employees (243 FTE) of many nationalities were running 40 shops with a sales area of 13,179 m² in Berlin, Bochum, Dresden, Hamburg, Köln, Krefeld, Leipzig, Neuss, Mönchengladbach and Oldenburg.

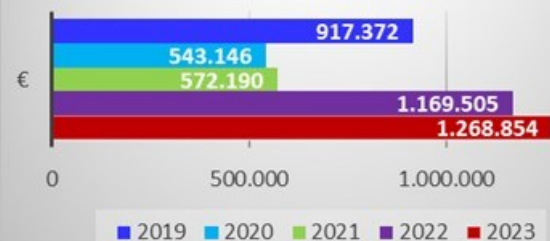
Shops per 31.12.

Contributions to Devel. Coop.

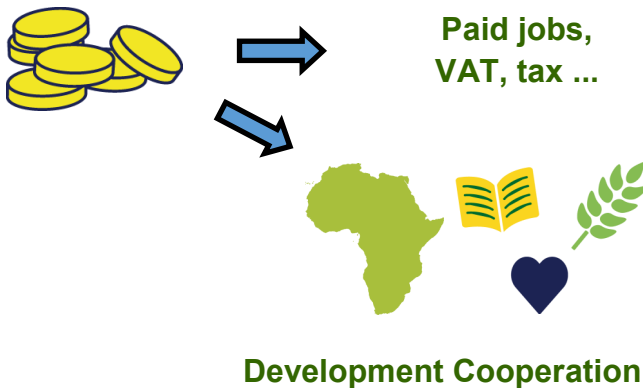




Our re-use finances collection & sorting.

Economic sustainability: normally, we do not depend on government subsidies.



We are a social business. These are created solely for the purpose of solving a social or environmental problem; owners don't take any dividend.

We pay wages to our staff and related costs such as public health insurance, unemployment insurance etc. We also pay full VAT and corporate tax.

We pay contributions to the Federation HUMANA People to People and to HUMANA People to People Deutschland e.V.



As in previous years, we sourced our electricity entirely from certified green supplier Naturstrom so that we create almost no CO2-emissions for electricity.

Our decent prices help reduce inequalities. At the same time, more and more of our customers buy second hand clothes in our shops because they want to contribute to a better world.
